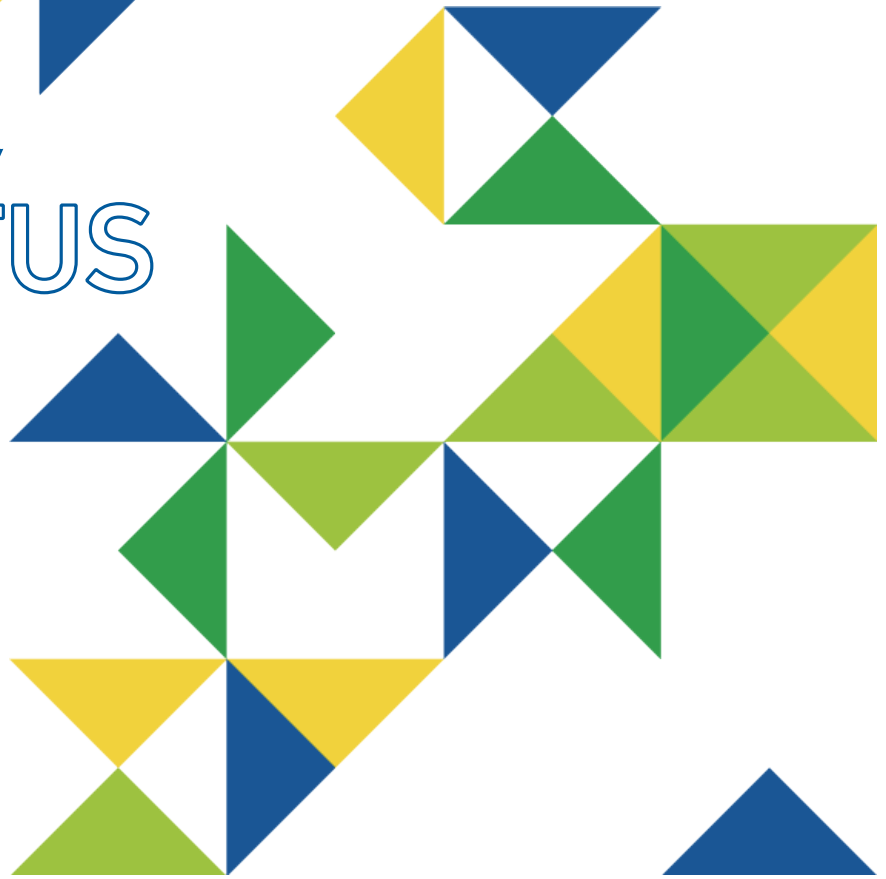

Hiroshima Shudo University (HSU) is guided by the long tradition of Shudo Gakuen, an educational foundation with a history dating back to 1725. Rooted in Hiroshima, Shudo Gakuen carries forward three centuries of scholarship, resilience, and cultural engagement.

HSU was established during an era when this city of Hiroshima was in the midst of a slow and purposeful reconstruction after being devastated by the atomic bomb on August 6th 1945. Through the concerted efforts of the people of Hiroshima, together with the support and encouragement from across Japan and around the world, the city was rebuilt step by step. HSU was expected to cultivate specialized professionals who would lead this recovery, and indeed, the University has produced many such graduates. The term "pioneer spirit", a favorite phrase of HSU's first president, Hakuji Harada, continues to accurately describe its educational philosophy.

Today, Hiroshima is globally renowned for its spirit of peace and renewal. It is also a place where daily life is both comfortable and inspiring. The city offers a safe and welcoming environment, with excellent public transportation, modern facilities, and a vibrant cultural scene. Students can enjoy local traditions such as *okonomiyaki*, explore lively shopping districts, and participate in seasonal festivals. Surrounded by mountains and the Seto Inland Sea, the area offers rich opportunities for outdoor activities such as cycling, fishing, and island hopping. Moreover, Hiroshima is passionate about sports, boasting professional teams in baseball, soccer, basketball and more. These teams embody the city's energy and community spirit, and their games offer students exciting opportunities to experience local culture and connect with the people of Hiroshima.

Within this environment, HSU has steadily expanded its academic fields. Throughout its long history, the institution has continuously worked to foster individuals who can contribute not only to the local community but also further afield within Japan and abroad.

Today, HSU is more determined than ever to keep moving forward and producing "pioneers" who can open new paths in this rapidly changing and diversifying global society. The HSU campus is surrounded by beautiful countryside and is just 30 minutes from the center of Hiroshima City by public transport. Students are able to concentrate on their studies while immersed in natural surroundings, and to take advantage of active learning opportunities both inside and outside the classroom, such as in farming villages and local businesses. We welcome students from all backgrounds, and we believe that international exchange enriches not only our classrooms but also the wider Hiroshima community. ## Hiroshima Peace Memorial (Genbaku Dome)

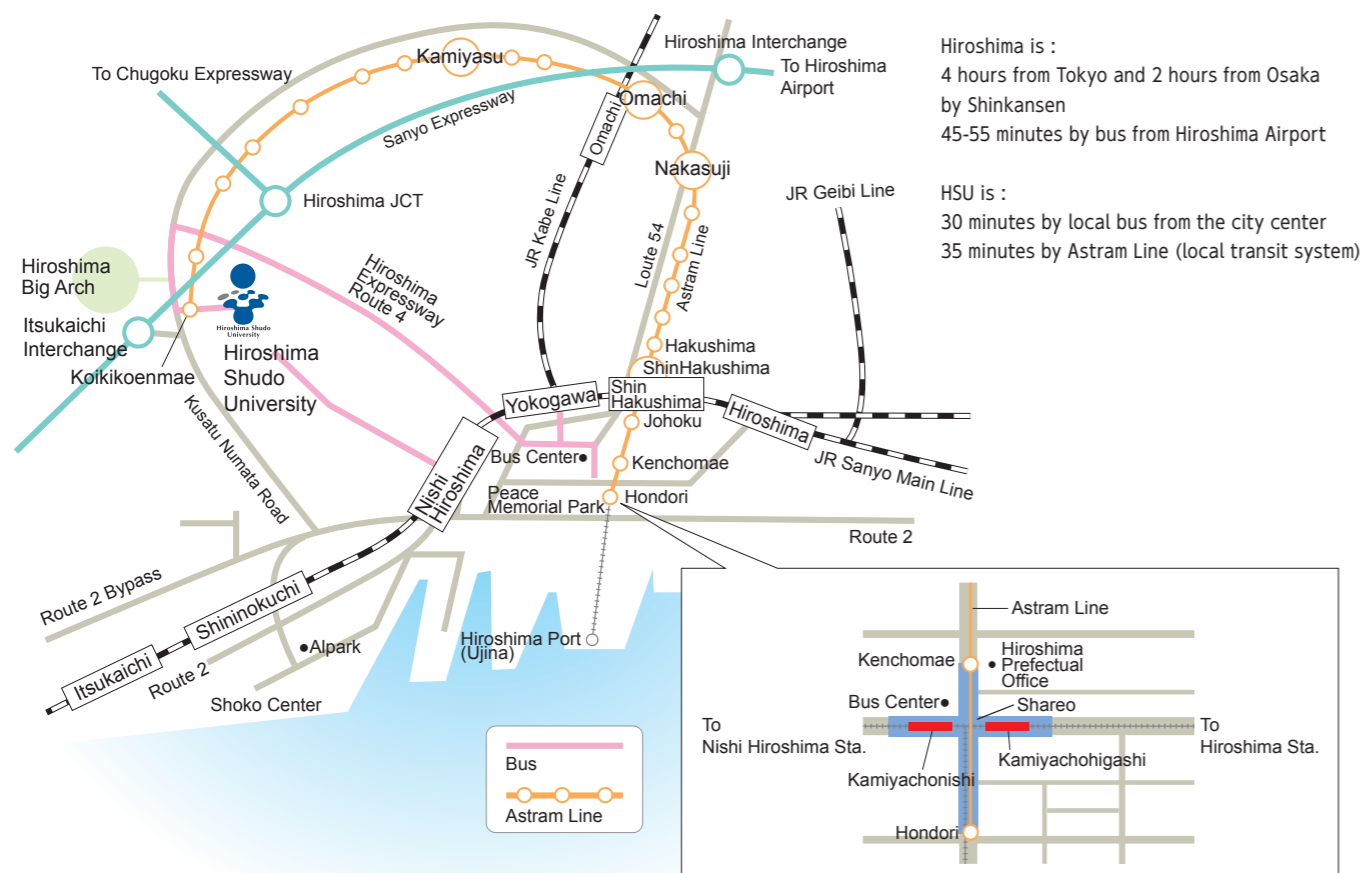

## Itsukushima Shinto Shrine (Miyajima)

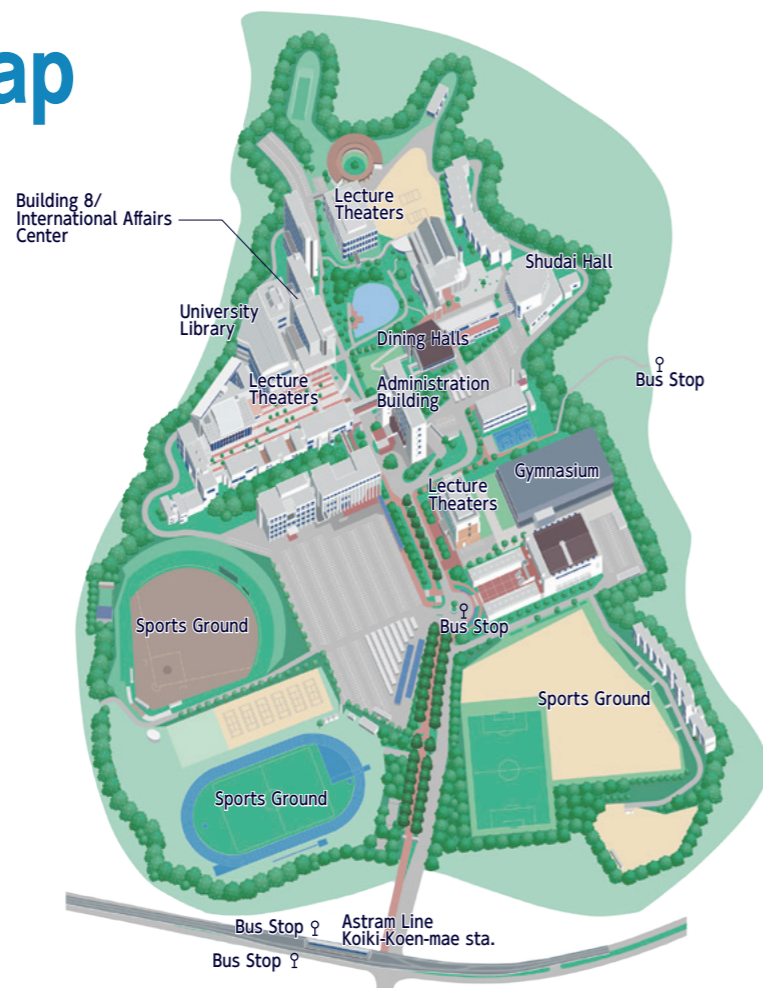

# Study Guide for Exchange Students

## Application

If you plan to attend one or two semesters at our university, please contact your university's international office. After we receive the nomination from your home university, we will accept the application materials through them.

## Application Deadlines

For 1 <sup>st</sup> Semester (Spring Semester)	Late October (Start of Lectures: Early April)
For 2 <sup>nd</sup> Semester (Fall Semester)	Mid March (Start of Lectures: Mid September)

## VISA

To enter Japan, international students require both a valid passport and a 'Student' Visa authorized by a Japanese Embassy or Consulate in their home country. In order to obtain the Visa, you must apply at your local Japanese Embassy or Consulate. Please email the Embassy or Consulate describing your COE (Certificate of Eligibility) which will be sent to you by the International Affairs Center of HSU. The COE is your proof that you are indeed eligible to enter Japan. With these documents, inspection relating to visa issuance can be performed quickly.

## Global Education Courses

### ▶Japanese and Japan Topics

Courses for international students who wish to enhance their academic and communicative Japanese language proficiencies. Classes are leveled (1. Beginner, 2. Intermediate1, 3. Intermediate2, 4. Advanced) according to the results of two online Japanese tests and an interview.

Japan Topics, open to both international and Japanese students, is a set of courses designed to further develop student knowledge of current Japan through examining topics such as politics, economics, environment and gender. Courses are taught in English or easy Japanese.

### ▶Multicultural Project

Multicultural Project is designed for Japanese and international students to engage in collaborative learning on various Japan-related themes toward the completion of a joint final project or presentation. Five to six courses are offered each semester of which roughly half are taught in English.



## Buddy Program

We match each international exchange student with an HSU student 'buddy' to support them during their studies here to ensure that their time in Japan is both fulfilling and fun. Feel free to ask them to help you with questions about life in Japan or the Japanese language.
