As a yonsei (fourth-generation Japanese in Hawai‘i), I am keenly aware of Hawai‘i’s complex and ever-changing ethnic, racial, gender, and class dynamics, as well as our islands’ complicated relationship to the United States and the wider Pacific region. I grew up and currently live in Mō‘ili‘ili, once a thriving Kanaka ‘Ōiwi agricultural landscape, later a center of the Japanese community, and now a multi-ethnic urban neighborhood undergoing dramatic changes. I typically teach courses focusing on Japanese and Okinawan experiences in Hawai‘i, Asian American history, ethnic identity, social movements, settler and Indigenous solidarity, and critiques of U.S. militarism and imperialism. I encourage students to apply their creativity and critical thinking skills to address contemporary problems of social and environmental justice.
